There is a time for everything

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven... – Ecclesiastes 3:1

I don't know exactly why these famous Bible verses come to my mind while watering my garden on a hot August evening. It is already getting dark and the noise of the day settles down; the cicadas pick-up, and everything seems to drift into a sort of calmness.

And I wonder why sometimes verses like "There is a time for everything" feel so true and sometimes they sound like hollow calendar mottos that you've read too often...

There is a time for everything—I think it is true. But I also think that it is our life's challenge to accept this knowledge, to ingest it, and to make it part of who we are. To realize where we are in our life, in that very day—and identify the time we're in, personally or as society.

For Pastor Matt, it was time for his sabbatical: time for days spent outside of routine rhythms, to take a step back, to widen the view beyond daily life, the congregation, and Palo Alto. For me, after serving at Grace for four years, it is time to step up, learn things about ministry that were, until now, not part of my job. It will be a time of intense activity, and I am sure that there will be challenges that I will have to overcome, but it will also be a very formative and strengthening experience.

And right now, as we are about to start the programming year, as we all fall back into our daily routines after the sweet break of summer, it might be a good question to pause on: What is the time for you now? Can you embrace it? What does it cost to embrace it?

You might ask what does all this have to do with faith? With God? Well, everything. It requires the same active passiveness to listen beyond our thoughts and see beyond our tunnel view.

May God bless our journey throughout this season and help us experience "our time."



Saturday, November 4 at 7pm is our special evening service for surviving families. It is a Taizé-style service for parents, siblings, and grandparents of deceased children (of any age).


Sunday, November 5 is All Saints Sunday. During both wor services, we will read the names of our deceased members from the past year and light candles for all our beloved.



The Mid-Peninsula CROP Walk is set for Sunday, 29 October, at 2 pm. Festivities will get underway at 1 pm featuring nametags, live music, and refreshements. This past year our congregation set a new high for the number of walkers from our church. As we set a record at the 2021 Walk for the most funds raised, this makes two years in a row Grace Lutheran Church Palo Alto has set records. Let's make it a three-peat!

As a wealthy community there are many in Palo Alto who do not see the face of hunger in our neighborhoods. Yet it is there in families where jobs have been lost, spouses have separated, and children suffer from eating disorders. Hunger is also in the communities around us. It is for this reason that the Mid-Peninsula CROP Walk designates 25% of all donations to the Ecumenical Hunger Project (EHP) in East Palo Alto.

While our particular Bay Area Walk designates recipients of this initial portion of our funds, participants are at liberty to designate where the remaining 75% of the funds are directed. Many in our congregation designate Lutheran World Relief using the following URL: https://lwr. org.

Confirmation Classes

Faith is something that develops and shapes us throughout our whole life. It's a continual process. The questions we have regarding our lives and choices change over time—and therefore it is good to be met where you are with your questions, with your experiences, doubts, challenges, hopes, and expectations—especially when you are a teen.

Therefore, we at Grace have a confirmation program that speaks to all facets of middle schooler life with room to explore your own faith. To ask questions. Express doubt. Discuss theories and life choices. Build community. Play games. To build corporate feeling, trust and the conscience of being part of a group are invaluable experiences, and an important part of what we want to offer our confirmands. The program consists of several components:

Wednesdays are Confirmation Class days! You can chose either the Zoom-class from 4:30-5:30pm or the in-person on Campus class from 7:00-8:00pm. We use different creative, fun, and playful approaches that promote interaction and encourage the confirmands to dive deep into their own faith, feelings, and opinions. We will talk about their life experiences and link them to Lutheran Christian contents, stories and values.

The other five components of the Grace Confirmation Program are: Sunday School (each Sunday between services), Mentor Program (once a month meetings with an adult member of Grace during Sunday school time), acolyting during the worship services (watch for the sign-up list), Worship Notes, and off-site options such as participating in camps and retreats. Sundayschool and the mentor program take place between our Sunday morning worship services. Acolyting will start up again on Rally Day—keep your eyes peeled for training sessions. Also on Rally Day, the confirmands will receive their Worship Notes to fill in during services. We are really excited that the Sierra Pacific Synod Youth Committee (SPSYC) is planning a Middle School Retreat again this year: Mark November 10-12, 2023 in your calendars.

The Confirmation Program at Grace Lutheran is traditionally an agemixed program for Middle Schoolers. If you have a 6th, 7th, or 8th grader that would like to join, please be in touch with Pr Friederike (see email below).

Confirmation Classes will start on **Wednesday, September 13. There** will be a parent night on Wednesday, September 6 at 7pm on **Zoom**.




We currently have four youth from Grace serving on that team: Charlotte Lungren, Rebecca Derrick, Annika Kulawik and Ty Cutler.

...no matter your pace

As I prepare for fall and all the excitement and busyness, it is easy to feel overwhelmed. Did I plan enough? Do enough? But then every once in a while I stop and remember all that I have gone through. This past year from last August till now was honestly one of the hardest years of my life. My mom was diagnosed with stage four breast cancer and a tumor was found and removed from her spine resulting in months of physical therapy and treatment that is ongoing. I moved my mom via airlift from one island and back for her surgery. I fought with insurance and Medicare for her coverage, almost non stop. All of this was happening as I started my masters program and continued to work full time.



Then out of no where my brother died of a heart attack sending my whole family into chaos and sadness. Then with very little notice I had to fly home and pack up my mom's apartment since she has been in long term care since December. The weight of everything often felt like too much, but I survived. One Sunday in the midst of all of this someone sat down next to me to check in and I said, "I am surviving that's about all I can do right now." They looked me in the eye and said, "You know you are remarkable, right?" I shrugged and they continued, "A lot of people wouldn't have been able to handle all this, and you did. It is miraculous." I haven't been able to stop thinking about this interaction and the way it made me realize everything written in the words below:



My challenge for you and for myself is to give ourselves a little more credit—we often are hard on ourselves, always pushing and asking if it is enough. But maybe you can also make room this fall to pause and give yourself credit for where you are now and all the ways you have grown and were strong. You are always growing and changing, and that is worth celebrating!

VBS RECAP


This summer over five Wednesday evenings we gathered together ALL Generations at Vacation Bible School with dinner and great activities. It was amazing and we welcomed several new families!

Our **Chancel Choir**, or the "adult choir" is open to any singer of high school age and up. **We will begin rehearsals on Wednesday, September 6 from 7:00-8:30 pm**, and will sing at the 10:45 service most Sundays beginning September 10. The choir sings a wide variety of music, accompanied and *a cappella*. Life Together dinner at 6:15 makes Wednesday evenings stress-free; you'll come to choir fed and happy! We welcome singers of any experience level, from beginners to the most experienced.

Are you interested in singing but not sure you can commit to every week? Contact me (tim@gracepa.org) and let's work out a deal! Perhaps an every-other-week schedule might work for you. Or maybe you'd like to make a short-term commitment. You could join now and sing just the fall Sundays. Or join in November for Advent and Christmas. Our year falls fairly naturally into blocks of about two months' length.

Praises Ring is the name of Grace's handbell choir. **We rehearse on Thursday afternoons from 5:30-6:30 pm** and will begin on **September 14**. The bell choir rings in church about one Sunday each month, plus Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday. We're always looking for a few good ringers! We own a full five-octave (61 note) set of handbells, and ideally need 13 people to make use of the full set. No prior experience with bell ringing is necessary, although some basic music-reading ability is helpful. We'll teach you all the rest!

A short term **Children's Choir project** will meet for just six weeks in November and December, with a performance at our children's Christmas program on December 17, and perhaps at a Sunday service in December or January if people are available. We will meet from 12:00 to 12:30 on Sundays for the length of this project. I'll remind you again when the time comes closer. Stay tuned! If it is successful we will do another one after the New Year.


Finally, are you an **adult** who has ever thought something like, "I like to sing but my voice isn't very good," or "I always wish I had learned how to read music"? **NOT CHOIR** is the place for you! In this Thursday night class, really a combination of singing and social hour, we relax and have fun learning the basics of congregational

singing. We start at the very beginning, starting with the assurance that no-one's voice is terrible and everyone's voice is needed! We sing just for the joy of it and try on some basics of vocal production. This is "how to sing" for adults who have never had a voice lesson or sung in a choir. We also practice some simple music reading skills. You might be amazed at how quickly you can learn to read the melody line of a hymn, even with no prior knowledge! We preview the hymns that will be sung in church on the upcoming Sunday, and (what seems to be the participants' favorite part) I've always got a video or three to show! **NOT CHOIR** meets on Thursdays from 7:00-8:00 pm, every week but the first Thursday of each month, beginning on September 14. We will NEVER perform! Sometimes there might be cookies, ALWAYS there is laughter!



Our monthly service of **Evening Prayer in the style of Taizé** continues on the second Sunday of each month. This quiet, deeply contemplative form of worship originated in the ecumenical religious community of Taizé in Burgundy, France. The community of about 100 brothers draws thousands of people (mostly under age 30) every summer for a time of spiritual reflection and renewal. Taizé worship is mostly singing: Much of it consists of very short musical phrases repeated over and over to become a sort of mantra. I have personally taken two weeklong retreats in the Taizé Community itself, and have experienced this form of worship to be moving and life-changing. Our next Taizé service at Grace will be **Sunday, September 10 at 7:00 pm** in the front of the Sanctuary. I look forward to seeing and singing with you there!

When we gather for worship every Sunday morning, every person in the room has something to contribute, whether large or small, to the combined voice of the assembly. When we sing hymns and other parts of the service together, we become an audible and visible sign of the Body of Christ. Our choir and handbell ensemble provide leadership and enhancement of this undertaking, but we all make the music together every Sunday. I thank God every week for all of your voices, and I look forward to another exciting year!
